 - Don't raise your voice or show signs of aggression, as this is considered extremely rude
 - Don't show affection in public



TRANSPORTATION

Metered taxis are not common. Your hotel can arrange cars. 3-wheeled taxis (called jumbos, tuk-tuks, or sahm-lor, depending on the location) are available. Negotiate fares in advance. Keep your hotel business card with you to show drivers your destination.

ETIQUETTE

• Do

- Do remove shoes and hats before entering a home or temple
- Do dress modestly, covering shoulders and knees
- If sitting on the floor, do avoid pointing your feet towards a person or a Buddha image
- Do ask permission before photographing people, especially if visiting hill tribes

• Don't

- Don't touch a monk or directly hand anything to him
- Don't raise your voice or show signs of aggression, as this is considered extremely rude and will not help your case
- Don't touch anyone on the head, as the head is considered sacred
- Don't use your left hand to touch, eat, or hand someone something
- Don't show intimacy in public



TRANSPORTATION

Bangkok taxis are metered and relatively inexpensive. Wave down a taxi if you see the "For Hire" sign lit, and make sure the driver uses the meter. Tuk-tuks, the 3-wheeled open-air taxis, are popular for short journeys within the city. Fares should be negotiated before starting your ride.



Day 2

07-MAR-18 (WED): SIEM REAP (B,L,D)

SIGHTSEEING IN ANGKOR

The crowning jewel of Khmer architecture, Angkor Wat is the national symbol and the highlight of any visit to Cambodia. The largest, best preserved, and most religiously significant of the Angkor temples, Angkor impresses visitors both by its sheer scale and beautifully proportioned layout, as well as the delicate artistry of its carvings. To approach the temple, first cross the vast moat, continuing along a broad causeway lined with naga balustrades. After entering the main building, ascend through a series of galleries and courtyards before reaching the central sanctuary, which offers beautiful views back over the causeway and across the surrounding countryside. On the way, stop to enjoy the intricate stone carvings that adorn nearly every surface, with some 1,700 Apsaras, or celestial dancers, sculpted into the walls. Along the outer gallery walls run the longest continuous bas-relief in the world, which narrates stories from Hindu mythology, including the famous Churning of the Ocean of Milk. Angkor Wat is stunning at any time of the day, but sunrise and sunset are especially beautiful times to watch the play of light on the stones.



Lunch at FCC Angkor Restaurant

The fortified city of Angkor Thom covers an area of 10 square km. Enter by the monumental South Gate over a causeway lined on either side by statues of demons and gods, each carrying a giant naga. Continue to the Terrace of the Elephants and the Terrace of the Leper Kings, former spaces for public ceremonies, both adorned with dramatic bas-reliefs. Visit the ruined Baphuon, Royal Enclosure and Phimeanakas before continuing to the mysterious Bayon Temple. In this temple, one of the most popular and compelling in Angkor, explore the galleries of beautifully preserved bas-reliefs and ascend narrow stairs to reach the central sanctuary, where you will find giant stone faces smiling enigmatically down at you from every angle.



Visit Ta Prohm, one of the most popular attractions of Angkor as much of the jungle has not been cleared and it looks very much as most of the Angkor monuments would have appeared when European explorers first stumbled across them.

Watch the sunset over the Cambodian countryside from the upper terraces of an ancient Angkorian temple.

PRIVATE DINNER AT KHMER VILLAGE HOUSE WITH TRADITIONAL APSARA PERFORMANCE

Unique Dining Experience Twilight Dinner at Amansara's Khmer Village House - As a rustic, intimate alternative to dining at Amansara we suggest an early twilight private dinner at Srah Srang, located in the heart of Angkor Archeological Park.

Our traditional wooden Khmer village house is set on stilts and over looks the 10-12th century royal bathing pool of Srah Srang that is fed by a natural spring.

Arrival is at dusk, ensuring beautiful views through the candlelit garden to the serene, still waters of the ancient pool. Linger over champagne on the veranda, listening to the soft sounds of our local musician whilst your personal chef fires up the charcoal to prepare a Khmer feast.

Day 3

08-MAR-18 (THU): SIEM REAP (B, L, D)

SPIRITUAL TOUR OF SIEM REAP

Undertake a spiritual journey and a water blessing on this morning or afternoon tour to a sacred shrine and a Buddhist temple.

Start the tour at a beautifully decorated shrine containing the statues of two sisters, thought to have been Angkorian princesses. The tall one is known as Preah Ang Chek, the shorter one as Preah Ang Chorm. They are believed to be almost one thousand years old and have a colourful history of power and indestructibility. Join the other pilgrims to make offerings and take photos at this sacred place of worship.

From here continue to a Buddhist temple for a private ceremony. Spend some time walking along the garden paths around the beautiful pagoda with its gilded spires.

Then enter into the peaceful temple and take a seat on the floor in front of the saffron-clad monks. Listen as they quietly chant in the ancient Buddhist language of Pali. Breathe in the aromas of the lotus and jasmine flowers and the burning incense as you offer your alms to the monks.

Then it is your turn to take part in an ancient Cambodian practise by receiving a traditional water blessing.

You can choose from two types of blessing. During the first blessing the monks will lightly sprinkle water over you as they chant harmoniously to wish you good luck, safe travel and a long life.

The second blessing involves blessed water being poured onto your head while the monks chant. If you choose this ritual you will be provided with a sarong to change into so that your clothing remains dry.

After the blessing, the monk will tie a thread around your wrist to bring good luck and prosperity.

ENJOY A LOCAL TOUCH BY INTRODUCTION TO THE VILLAGE, INCLUDING A VISIT TO THE LOCAL SCHOOL AND RICE FIELDS

Bakong Village: located about 20 km from town. Please note this is a real village not a replica set up for tourists to visit.

Discover the rice fields a long the way to the Bakong village, visit the local school and talk with the students and teachers. After that visit the village and interact with the villagers.

Finally, enjoy a refreshing drinks and snack before return back to hotel.



TEMPLE DINNER ANGKOR

What could be more romantic and memorable than a luxury dining experience at a sacred Angkor temple?

To start the evening in the right way you will be collected from your hotel. Sit back and relax as you drive in style to a remote temple deep in the Angkor complex. Lit up by candles and torches this is the perfect venue for a dreamy dinner under the stars.

On arrival you will be greeted by a dancer and the sound of drumming from the live musicians.

After a pre-dinner cocktail sit down next to the ancient ruins at a table specially decorated with tropical flowers.

Enjoy a delicious dinner with free-flow wine served to you by attentive but discreet staff. As you eat, savour the atmosphere of the crumbling surroundings, the traditional Angkor music and the exquisite Apsara dancers.

Upon arrival in Luang Prabang passengers will have their immigration and customs arranged by the local ground handler. Whilst these formalities take place passengers can remain on-board the aircraft and then will be escorted to the fast track counter for required photograph by immigration and then transfer to your hotel.

LUNCH AT LA BELLE EPOQUE AT THE LUANG SAY RESIDENCE

(Lunch A La Carte Menu Included bottle of drinking water and soft drink)

A WAT TO WAT INSIDER WALKING TOUR

Afternoon discover the main sights of Luang Prabang and get an insider's view of the religion and culture from a renowned photographer and author. Along with your own private guide take an eco-friendly electric car to the centre of the city to start your walking tour. Stroll through the winding streets to the most beautiful and oldest temple Wat Visoun and visit That Makmo, also known as the Watermelon Stupa. Continue to Wat Xieng Thong, Luang Prabang's best-known and most visited monastery. The three tiered roof sweeps low to the ground and the walls have been beautifully decorated in black lacquer and gold leaf. The back of the temple features an intricate glass mosaic of the tree of life set on a dark red background. We walk along Nam Khan River to reach the next sight Wat Khili. Here at the temple you will meet Hans Georg Berger, a photographer and writer who has produced photography projects about world religions, and participated in art and education projects in Laos. He currently has a permanent exhibition, 'The Floating Buddha', in the temple itself. Hans will take you on a private tour of the exhibition and share his extensive knowledge and expertise about Laos. Our final stop on this walking tour is the National Museum, which once served as the Royal Palace. After a short orientation tour through the Museum we transfer back to the hotel by the electric car.

ATTEND A TRADITIONAL BACI CEREMONY AT AMANTAKA

A traditional baci, or "Sou Khouan" ceremony, a Brahmin-influenced ritual that has been practiced in Luang Prabang for hundreds of years. Locals believe that 32 spirits, or Khouan, inhabit our bodies and protect us from illness, sadness and general malice in everyday life. Their influence works best if all the Khouan are working together, but from time to time they need to be re-aligned and perhaps told about an individual's arrival or departure to a new environment. Celebrations such as honeymoons, birthdays and anniversaries are also wonderful occasions to experience this ceremony. The blessing is a community affair, overseen by a master of ceremonies, Mo Phon, who repeats the rhythmic ritual words and chants to the spirits, reminding them of their duties.

Day 5

LUANG PRABANG (B, L, D)

BEHIND THE SCENES OF THE BEAR SANCTUARY WITH PICNIC BY THE WATERFALLS

Spend a day feeding bears in a sanctuary and discovering a multi-tiered waterfall. Drive outside the city to the Bear Rescue Centre Kuang Si Waterfall where you will be greeted by the manager who will personally guide you through the park. See one of Lao's most endangered species; learn about the threats to these beautiful animals and what is being done to help protect Laos' precious wildlife. You will also have a chance to meet the bears at close quarters and aid the keepers at feeding time. Carry on to the Kuang Si Waterfall where cool, clear water cascades over limestone formations. The water tumbles down for about 100 metres and gathers into stunning turquoise pools. Relax over a private picnic lunch while enjoying the spectacular scenery.

SUNSET MEKONG CRUISE

Absorb the magic of dusk in Luang Prabang on a private cruise as the sun sets behind forested mountains. Enjoy a refreshing Aperitif or one of our signature cocktails served by personal bartender as you float down the river. Witness the end-of-day local rituals as villagers return home on small boats and fishermen check their catches.

Feel free to return to the hotel by Amantaka's tuk tuk, or walk leisurely through the streets past the bustling night market en route to Amantaka.

Day 6

11-MAR-18 (SUN): LUANG PRABANG - YANGON (B, L, D)

THIS MORNING, MEET AND TRANSFER TO AIRPORT FOR THE FLIGHT TO YANGON

LUANG PRABANG INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT ASSISTANCE SERVICE

PRIVATE AIRCRAFT LUANG PRABANG - YANGON
(FLIGHT TIME: 10:00-11:20)

As soon as you arrive at the exit gate, you are welcomed by your guide and Burmese girls in traditional custom with flowers. Then we transfer to your hotel.

Yangon lies in the fertile delta of southern Myanmar, on the wide Yangon River. The city is filled with tree-shaded boulevards, while shimmering stupas float above the treetops. The city became the capital only in 1885, when the British completed the conquest of Upper Myanmar and Mandalay's brief period as capital of the last Burmese kingdom ended.

Lunch at The Strand Hotel Restaurant

(Myanmar Set Menu or Western set menu with bottle of drinking water and soft drink included)

COLONIAL WALKING TOUR

Explore the architectural heritage of Yangon and learn the fascinating secrets behind the city's colonial style buildings. Yangon's streets are full of magnificent buildings dating from the late 19th century. While some have been restored to their former glory, others are dilapidated and crumbling - in ruins after decades of isolation. Start your exploration by the golden Sule Pagoda. Pass by the City Hall, a fine example of British Myanmar architecture featuring traditional three-tiered roofs; and the red and white brick High Court Building with its clock tower.

See the elegant Emmanuel Baptist Church situated on the corner of Mahar Bandoola Park, a green oasis popular with Tai-Chi practitioners. Photograph the derelict Secretariat Building, a beautiful Victorian structure where Aung San, father of pro-democracy leader Aung San Suu Kyi, was assassinated in 1947. Walk down Strand Road to explore the historic but abandoned Gandhi Hall, where the National League for Democracy drafted the Gandhi Hall Declaration in 1990.

Afterwards, explore Myanmar's last Armenian Church, St. John the Baptist. Dating back over 150 years this small beautiful church is surprisingly well maintained and offers a patch of calm in the middle of the bustling city. Also visit the Post Office; the legendary Strand Hotel; the Port Authority building; and the Accountant General's Office & Currency Department, home to an exquisite ornamented winding staircase.

End the tour at the Yangon Heritage Trust, a non-profit organization that works to preserve and protect the rich urban heritage to ensure the city's architectural history is not lost.



SPIRIT OF MYANMAR

Spend a spiritual evening making offerings and watching the glowing colours of the golden stupas of Myanmar's most famous landmark. Just before sunset arrive at the stunning Shwedagon Pagoda, the most sacred place in Myanmar with a history stretching back over 2,500 years.

Its bell-shaped superstructure, resting on a terraced base, is covered in about 60 tonnes of gold-leaf causing it to glisten and glimmer in the light of the setting sun. Every evening the residents of the city assemble at the pagoda to meditate and pay their respects to the Buddha. Enjoy the flickering lights and delicate aromas of candles and sticks of incense being lit as offerings, and observe the saffron-clad monks passing through the temple. Get your camera ready to take some footage of the glowing stupas set against the darkening sky.

Join in this very special and unique ceremony with an offering of oil lamps, followed by a meeting with the Head of Board of Trustees of the Shwedagon Pagoda for a personal tour of the temple and the chance to ask lots of in-depth questions.

Note: Dress code is as most religious temples in Asia; wear trousers or at least knee-length shorts or skirt; t-shirts with elbow length sleeves are also expected and you are expected to be barefooted when entering Shwedagon Pagoda.

Day 7

12-MAR-18 (MON): YANGON (B,L,D)

VISIT THE AMAZING RAILWAY MARKET BY TRAIN

Get up early morning for the lively local market activities at Danyingone Market, practically known as Railway Market. The Market is situated in Danyingone, outskirts of Yangon City. Transfer to the Yangon Railway Station first, wait for the daily circular train heading to Danyingone Market and may encounter vendors and hawkers carrying vast amount of vegetables to sell them at the local markets.

Enjoy the circular train ride about nearly one and a half hour, after passing through Insein station, you will discover the green fields, small wooden houses and some factories as a signal that you are out of Yangon city. Then the busy Danyingone market station awaits you with full of locals, vendors and hawkers selling & buying colourful vegetables, meats, local snacks and flowers.

Some of the vendors and hawkers are selling on the railway, every time a train approaches, they carry the goods they are selling and move away from the railway. And once the train leaves the station, they come back and sell again on the railway. This lively scenery is one of the best local encounters and very lively for photo-shooting. Also pay a visit and walk around the main market where you will see locals buying, selling and carrying the vegetables with motorcycles, trishaws, tuktuk and types of vehicles modified by locals.

Discover local foods in the main market such as Mohinga, a rice noodle with fish soup, an essential Burmese cuisine and a typical breakfast for Burmese. Afterwards, return back to Yangon by car.

14-MAR-18 (WED): PHUKET (B) MORNING AT LEISURE

VISIT PHUKET ELEPHANT SANCTUARY (AFTERNOON - JOIN IN BASIS)

12:30 -13:00 Pick up from AMANPURI and transfer to the office of Phuket Elephant Sanctuary by our vehicle (30 minutes)
13:30 Meet at the Elephant Sanctuary office at Paklok and continue by Sanctuary local truck or minivan to access the camp (5 minutes)

An Afternoon with the Elephants begins with a picturesque drive down a country lane into the grounds of our sanctuary.

Welcome and Education video. Set off to explore the sanctuary to locate the elephants. Stroll around or sit quietly observing the elephants at a respectful distance.

Late afternoon, we will walk the elephants back to their night shelters under the tree lined archway. Feed the elephants. Then, enjoy Complimentary filtered water, coffee, tea, soft drinks and canape

Transfer back by local truck or minivan to Paklok. Afterward, change the transportation to our van and transfer back to hotel.
